Voices for Children of Broward County (Voices) is a nonprofit dedicated to supporting children in foster care across Broward County, ensuring they have the resources and programs they need for health, education, and social well-being. Serving approximately 1,500 children in the foster care system, we provide comprehensive support through our core programs—Emergency and Normalcy Program, Dream BIG Days, The School Break Food & Wellness Program, Fostering Hope, and Hope Haven by addressing the diverse challenges faced by these children.

Our suite of programs addresses the diverse needs of children in foster care both during and outside of school hours.

Programs & Services

- Emergency & Normalcy Needs Program** - provides vital support to children in foster care by addressing immediate needs and promoting a sense of stability and normalcy in their lives.
- Dream Big Days** - offers children in foster care unique and memorable experiences, empowering them to explore interests and create lasting memories.
- School Break Food & Wellness Program** - bridges the gap for children in foster care by providing nutritious meals, wellness activities, and essential support during out of school time, fostering their overall well-being and resilience.
- Fostering Hope** - supports youth, ages 15-22 preparing to transition out of the foster care system towards independent living.
- Hope Haven** - provides essential items and support to children and families in need, promoting empowerment and dignity.

Impact

On any given day, there are nearly 391,000 children in foster care in the United States, with a little over 1,500 children in foster care in Broward County. Each year, Voices serves over 2,500 children in our community.
